



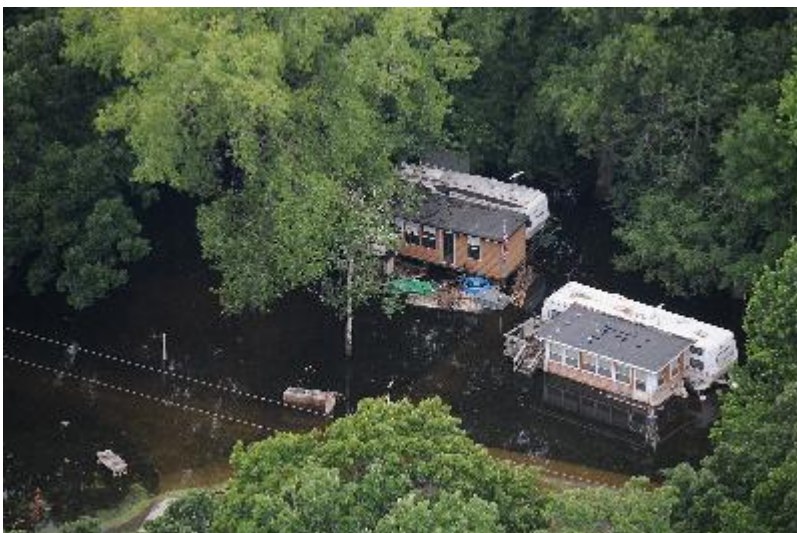

Spring Green, Wisconsin, July 11, 2008 -- Four weeks after heavy rains fell on Central and Southern Wisconsin, many homes are still under water. One housing area in Spring Green has 32 homes that remain inaccessible to their owners.

July 8, 2008, Ft. Atkinson, Wisconsin-- Five weeks after heavy rains fell on central and southern Wisconsin, many mobile homes in low lying areas along the Rock River still had accessibility issues. FEMA Community Relations and Mitigation Teams closely monitor these areas, in anticipation of providing aid to the homeowners once the water subsides.

“It's interesting and rewarding work There are 340 FEMA people here in Wisconsin & while many of the workers are issued a little point & shoot camera, I am the only hired photographer, so I get all of the choice assignments like Blackhawk helicopter rides with the Governor, the General in charge of the National guard, the higher ups in FEMA, etc., when they go out for a look see to find out how much the flood waters have receded. Plus they send me out on trips all over the state to get a picture of this, a picture of that, etc. Taking pictures is only 25% of the work tho, as when I get back to the office, I then have to edit all of my shots, write captions, send them off to various people/locations, make photo CD's, etc. Other than my boss funneling photo assignments to me, they pretty much leave me alone to do whatever I want to do” Walt
